Please send your child to school in comfortable simple clothing that is free of complicated fastenings. Please consider the messy art materials and other messy activities and provide **clothing that is washable** (smocks will be worn during messy art activities).

Think of our playground and provide clothing and shoes that are sturdy. **Please do not send children in slip-on shoes, flip-flops, or crocs.**

Please be aware of the following:

- 🌸 All Early Childhood children should wear shirts with sleeves (no tank tops).
- 🌸 All Pre-K and Kindergarten boys are required to wear a Kippah or hat and Tzitzis to school.
- 🌸 All Pre-K and Kindergarten girls should wear skirts.

Always label all of your children's clothing!

Elementary Division Uniform Code

Chazal tell us that our external actions and appearance directly affect our internal makeup. It is, therefore, essential that the young *Torah* student dress in a fashion which is neat, demonstrates personal pride and dignity, and is in accordance with the Torah's guidelines for *Tznius*, modesty. These standards create the atmosphere which is most conducive for our children's personal, academic, and religious growth. To facilitate the creation of this ambiance, Torah Academy has established the following uniform dress requirements.

Uniform for Elementary Boys

Students are required to wear the school uniform. Any combination of the uniform choices listed below can be worn.

1. Shirts

- a. White, hunter green, light blue or navy blue polo shirt with collar
- b. All shirts need to have a collar. All shirts must have **Torah Academy embroidered on it**
- c. All buttons, with the exception of the top one, should be buttoned

2. Pants

- a. Navy Blue, Black, or Khaki
- b. Straight or pleated
- c. Straight or cuffed bottom (no elastic cuffs)
- d. No sweats, cargo pants, jeans, shorts, or corduroy

3. Shoes

- a. Sneakers or shoes may be worn
- b. No sandals, slippers, Natives, Crocs, or slipper-like shoes
- c. No shoes or sneakers with wheels

4. Socks

Socks are required to be visible above the ankle

5. Sweatshirts

- a. Solid Navy or black TABR branded or plain sweatshirts only.
- b. Inscriptions, words, slogans, logos, or pictures are not permitted.

6. Mitzvos

- a. Conservative, short haircuts, with ears and neck fully visible. Be sure barber does not trim above cheekbone.
- b. Boys in all classes are required to Yarmulkes at all times (no hats or caps in the building).
- c. Tzitzis are required to be worn at all times.

The look of our boys should be one that represents dignified Torah Students; one of refined and good taste. Clothing should be neat and not stained.

Uniform for Elementary Girls

Students are required to wear the school uniform. Any combination of the uniform choices listed below can be worn.

1. Shirts

- a. White, hunter green, light blue or navy polo shirt with collar
- b. Shirts need to have a collar, and no capped sleeves. All shirts must have **Torah Academy embroidered on it**
- c. All buttons, with the exception of the top one, should be buttoned
- d. Please make sure that no shirts are of sheer or tight-fitting material
- e. **Fourth grade girls and older are required to wear at least $\frac{3}{4}$ sleeves that cover the elbow**

2. Skirts

- a. Plaid or navy pleated uniform skirt.
- b. The skirts should be long enough to cover the knee when sitting down.
Fourth grade girls and older require skirts long enough to cover mid-calf.

3. Shoes

- a. Shoes or sneakers may be worn
- b. No sandals, slippers, Natives, Crocs, or slipper-like shoes
- c. No shoes or sneakers with wheels

4. Socks

- a. Knee socks, tights, or ankle socks should be worn that fit comfortably above the ankle.
- b. Leggings may only be worn to school if not at all visible.

5. Sweatshirts

Solid Navy or black TABR branded or plain sweatshirts only. Inscriptions, words, slogans, logos, or pictures are not permitted.

6. Hair

A girl's hair should look refined and appropriate for a Torah student.

The look of our girls should be one that represents dignified *Torah* Students; one of refined and good taste. Clothing should be simple and practical. Clothing should be neat and not stained.

Chazal tell us that our external actions and appearance directly affect our internal makeup. It is, therefore, essential that the young Torah student dress in a fashion which is neat, demonstrates personal pride and dignity, and is in accordance with the Torah's guidelines for Tznius and modesty. These standards create the atmosphere which is most conducive for our children's personal, academic, and religious growth.

Pants: Solid color dress pants in good repair (no cargo pants, jeans, etc.) No bright or neon colors or styles that may affect a refined image.

Shirt: Solid color button down shirt with collar.

Shoes: Fully closed shoes or sneakers only that are becoming of a Ben Torah (rubber soles are permissible). Slip-ons, crocs, etc. are not permitted.

Undershirt: White only

Socks: Socks are required to visible above the ankle

Sweaters/Sweatshirts: Solid Navy or black TABR branded or plain sweatshirts only. Inscriptions, words, slogans, logos, or pictures are not permitted.

Yarmulka: No hats or caps on school campus. Please bring yarmulka clips for sports. Yarmulke colors should be solid, and not fluorescent or containing secular logos or themes.

Tzitzis: Tzitzis are to be worn at all times.

Girls' Middle School Dress Code

2017-18

Chazal tell us that our external actions and appearance directly affect our internal makeup. It is, therefore, essential that the young Torah student dress in a fashion which is neat and demonstrates personal pride and dignity. These standards create the atmosphere which is most conducive for our girls' personal, academic, and spiritual growth. We have therefore established the following dress code for our students:

1. Blouses

- a. Button down shirt, pastel-light pink, blue or yellow (with a white shell only underneath) with TABR embroidered on the collar. Sleeves must comfortably cover the elbows. Blouses may not be tight fitting.
- b. All buttons, with the exception of the top one, need to be buttoned.

2. Skirts

- a. Navy blue uniform pleated skirt.
- b. The skirts need to be long of ankle or mid-calf length. Skirts need to reach the ankle or up to 6 inches above the ankle.

3. Shoes

- a. Shoes or sneakers
- b. No sandals, Natives or Crocs (i.e. shoes must be closed toe and have a closed back)

4. Socks

Knee socks are required.

5. Sweatshirts

Solid Navy or black TABR branded or plain sweatshirts only. Inscriptions, words, slogans, logos, or pictures are not permitted.

At times, in honor of Rosh Chodesh, our GMS are encouraged to dress up in nicer clothing that does not conform to uniform guidelines. Please ensure that clothing choices at these events reflect the highest standards of a Bas Torah.

The girls' feelings are of utmost importance to all of us. Please help us avoid an uncomfortable situation by ensuring that your daughter comes to school in clothing that conforms to these dress code requirements.
