Torah Academy Chanukah Concert Delights a Sold-Out Crowd

It was a night of Jewish music unlike any other, as Torah Academy of Boca Raton's Fifth Annual Chanukah Community Concert dazzled a sold-out audience of more than 2,300 people with its unique lineup of seasoned and fresh-faced performers, pitch-perfect venue, and mesmerizing special effects. The event featured Jewish singing megastar Yaakov Shwekey, a worldwide performer who has been at the forefront of Jewish music for over two decades; Mordechai Shapiro, a young rising star adding hit after hit song to his repertoire; a group of talented, enterprising 12th-grade boys from the Mesivta of Waterbury in Connecticut; and Torah Academy of Boca Raton's own Boys Middle School Choir, who performed their own arrangements and sang with Shapiro. With an ideally-outfitted auditorium, the event was enhanced by a multi-media show on three giant LED screens, allowing video, lights, and digital enhancements

to electrify the room. The performers repeatedly brought the crowd to its feet, with Mordechai Shapiro inviting all the children in the audience on stage to sing one of his songs with him.

The concert was rife with meaning in both the songs reverberating around the room and the people taking center stage. The spotlight was shared several poignant times during the show, beginning with Shwekey and Shapiro reuniting for a duet of an early Shwekey hit as they remembered singing together when Shapiro was a young boy. Even in his heart-thumping, blood-pumping rhythms, Yaakov Shwekey sang of igniting the soul and appreciating the potential within, a beautiful complement to a night celebrating Jewish education

Fittingly, several numbers showcased the Torah Academy Boys Middle School Choir, carefully orchestrated by their teacher Rabbi Netanel Chait. In weeks of

practice beforehand, Rabbi Chait encouraged participation from all his students no matter their singing skill level, while also giving opportunities to particularly musical boys to hone their talents through solos and small collaborations. One of the choir participants, seventh grader Avi Rosman remarked, "It was unforgettable to have the chance to sing with these world-fa-mous performers." Aharon Weiss of the sixth grade commented, "At first it was scary to perform in front of so many people, but as I got more comfortable it became really exciting!"

The concert was once again principally sponsored by Linda Love Golden, who has been a steadfast and generous supporter of the school for many years. As a show of Torah Academy's deep gratitude, she was presented with a framed picture of a stageful of Torah Academy children singing with Shwekey, with hundreds of signatures of grateful students dotting the

photograph's mat.

Rabbi Chaim Glazer, Torah Academy administrator and concert coordinator, commented. "This is not just a night to clap to the beat. It's an opportunity to thank our supporters in a meaningful, memorable way, and to showcase performers that maximize their G-d-given talents to uplift and unite our People. That is a powerful educational message for the children of our school and our community that mirrors Torah Academy's philosophy."
